COMMUNITY UMPIRE PROGRAMME - PILOT





Introduction

All cricket in New Zealand is played with at least two umpires in the middle. Unfortunately, there are only about 300 registered official active club umpires in New Zealand, so majority of club cricket is umpired by player umpires.

Over time, there has been a want and need to support those grades of club cricket that do not get officially appointed umpires every game and rely on the abilities of players who do not necessarily have a knowledge of the Laws of Cricket but are expected to make educated decisions. This lack of knowledge could then lead to possible poor player behaviour, the Spirit of Cricket is tested and the overall playing experience is soured.

New Zealand Cricket & Christchurch Metro Cricket Association's **Community Umpire Programme** was piloted during the 2023-24 season, as an opportunity to help support the players who have to umpire their own matches on the weekend. The emphasis of this programme is to educate, observe and support player umpires.

How was this achieved?

- · Most importantly, the programme was endorsed by Christchurch Metro Cricket Association and it's affiliated clubs.
- Each team were encourage to have a minimum of 2 players to attend a pre-season Community Umpire's Course.
- The incentive for attending was 1 competition point for each team.
- Course was initially delivered by NZC with support from the local Umpire's Association.
- · The course was delivered at a number of local clubrooms.
- During the season, we committed to doing a number of boundary observations, to assist the development of the umpires and allow for feedback.
- · Hosted an end-of-season get together to review and reflect on the programme.

The intended outcomes of this programme are the following:

- 1. Confident player umpires.
- 2. Minimise player behaviour issues.
- 3. Improved cricketing experience.
- 4. Indirect recruitment tool.



The programme also had a direct impact on my umpiring abilities. I felt more in control of the game and was able to handle difficult situations with ease. My rule knowledge improved significantly, which boosted my confidence in making quick and fair decisions. I had a newfound appreciation for the game's intricacies and the role of umpires in ensuring fair play. It was rewarding to contribute to the game in a meaningful way and be part of the action on the field.

The experience with the programme has definitely been a catalyst for me to pursue umpiring after playing. The knowledge and skills I've gained have inspired me to take the next step and become an official umpire. However, my preference lies in playing the magnificent game rather than umpiring now.

It was motivating to learn from others and share experiences, creating a supportive environment for growth. The camaraderie among participants and the mentorship from experienced umpires were the elements of the programme I enjoyed the most. For next season, I would love to see more opportunities for practical experience, such as umpiring at different levels of play, Quiz nights, umpiring camps, etc."
